(grandchilden) are Puohala students. Penny will talk of her journey as a non-Mäori language speaker who made the decision along with her late täne (kāne) Toni Waho, to raise their two children only speaking to them in the

Maori language. She will tell the story of establishing Mana Tamariki - a Köhanga Reo (Punana Leo) and Kura Kaupapa Maori (Kula Kaiapuni and Kula Ki'eki'e). The trials and joys of 'IT' - Intergeneration
